	This means Lions membership development in Europe needs to be improved and we need to get the support of all Past International Directors to improve our work.		
	This means they need to be kept well informed.		
	The size of the LTE committee and its management needs to be reviewed so it is proposed that a steering group is set up to work together with the LRPCE Chairperson, Secretary, LTE Chair Geoff and Vice-Chair Barbara so a proposal can be submitted to the LRPCE for discussion. The proposal will need to take into account the LTE Job Specification recently submitted to the LRPCE.
